# 1.02 Chair Report

- Attended the Vet Enhancement program at the WCVM as announced by Minister Marit & Minister Wyant on Sept 29
- Oct 6 attended a discussion on research at LFCE
- Announcement of Harold Martens resignation from LSS & CRSB
- Received many calls looking for government financial help in filling dugouts & other matters related to the drought in specific areas.

#### 1.03 CEO Report

- Sept 27 met with Buffalo Plains Cattle Co and provincial officials on efforts to modernize standards for boilers
- Sept 29 Attended the JGL Forum had presentations and dialogue from speakers Ted Bilyea (former Maple Leaf foods executive), Josh Linville (VP of Fertilizer for StoneX Financial), & Dr. Sylvain Charlebois (professor of food distribution, Dalhousie)
- Interview w/ CTV regarding drought in Saskatchewan and its effects on Saskatchewan Producers
- Attended the Carbon Summitt put by Carbon RX
- Attended Beyond the Harvest Summit put on by SIIT and Nutrien interesting livestock sector was lacking in representation
- Have had multiple meetings with Canadian forage and Grasslands Assoc. regarding the On Farm Climate Action Fund
  - Concessions made by federal government to shorten the length of time before producers are credited for offsets
  - The program will happen with or without SCA participation, but it may limit how many dollars get into the producers' hands, and we will have less influence on the potential projects and mentors that are considered.
  - o Pros and Cons to be considered. Have discussed somewhat with Scott Wright (LFCE), he believes the program could be useful, but shares our same concerns.
- Chair and CEO have both been in contact with Ag Minister's office on interim support program for producers still struggling with drought, particularly the high costs of transportation for feed. Had a discussion with the FI Minister's office. HOC program not likely
- AG MO is supportive of lobbying the federal government to expand LPI as a national program
  and provide cost shared premiums on par with Crop Insurance: it was a policy program they
  put forward while previously negotiating the new CAP agreement. We have submitted a policy
  position on this to the federal government as well for their budget submission requests and have
  been working closely with CCA on additional communications with the federal government.
  - Action item Government/Policy Committee to convene a meeting to discuss.
- Update on the boards request for insight into Quebec and Ontario LPI programs unsuccessful
  attempts to get a hold of experts in Quebec, but Ontario programs provide a cost shared
  program with the province paying 40%. It can be stacked with AgriStability, but there is a limit to
  the provincial dollars that can be earned from both.
- Crop insurance provided statistics on predation insurance coverage: since 2017 SCIC has received 290 claims and denied 7, paid out \$400k on the claims. 240 were paid out at 100%, 43 at 50%. Open to suggestions for improvement an also looking to hear if there are producers who aren't calling or are being told before they can make a claim that they will be ineligible.

Additional discussions ongoing with changes to monitoring and declarations made under the
Livestock Tax Deferral. Proposed self-declaration and improvement rainfall and weather data
collection. Have sent our suggested changes to federal officials and are also working with CCA.
Will likely require amendments to the *Income Tax Act*, which means major changes will not be
on the immediate horizon.
